

Invitation to LGBTQIA Pride 2022: Speak Love... Speak Peace... Speak Out!

Some of us, this author included, can still remember the tentative feeling of taking it up as a church practice, not really knowing if Pride really had a place in the Church (big "C"). Yet, five years later, we joyfully celebrate Pride as a way of advocating for, affirming, and welcoming those in the LGBTQ+ community who have not been fully included in the Church.

This June, the Social Justice Team invites you to celebrate LGBTQ+ Pride. Our motto and theme this year will be "Speak Love. Speak Peace. Speak out!" Our activities will center on using our speech to proclaim God's love for creation and demonstrating our affirmation of the LGBTQIA community. We kick off our LGBTQ+ observance with our first ever "Stories and Doughnuts: Drag Queen Story Hour". Additionally, we invite our church community to come together at the church picnic to create a festive Pride Banner that welcomes and affirms members of the LGBTQIA community. And...you've heard of "Name Tag Sunday"... this year we will celebrate "Pronoun Sunday" in which we invite you to write your name, as well as your pronouns. Finally, our celebration culminates in Pride Sunday, on June 26th.
